## **RECYCYCLE/COMPOST**

As everyone can tell by the full bins of recycle and big piles of compost, we're getting great response from lots of people. A big thank you to all who continue to help us and the environment.

We've mentioned it before and we'll mention it again. One thing that definitely helps all recyclers is to please take the lids off plastic containers and **RINSE EVERYTHING OUT**. Putting dirty containers into recycle bins just attracts rodents, ants, flies and it stinks! Rinsing only takes a few seconds. Also please take newspapers out of plastic bags before they go into bins and recycle both in the appropriate containers. Lastly, do not toss plastic bags of compostable refuse onto the compost pile. Please dump the contents in the compost heap and dispose/recycle the plastic bags in their appropriate containers. There are containers marked for Styrofoam in the Main Hall and the Card Hall. Please empty cups and wipe off trays or dishes (don't need to wash them) before putting them in the containers.)
