FROM THE PARK MANAGERS...



February bills are available for payment. Rent is due on the 1st of February. WE MUST RECEIVE PAYMENT NO LATER THAN 4:00 PM Friday, February 10th.

RV Reservations – Now is the time to make your reservations for the 2017-2018 season for the site you currently occupy. We call this the “Closed Season”. If you wish to make a reservation for a different site, “Open Season” will begin on March 1, 2017. We require a \$200.00 deposit for all RV reservations which is reimbursable up until your date of arrival. If you have questions regarding this policy, please see the office. RV reservations for mobile home sites will cost an additional \$50.00 per month.

Park Model Rental Reservations – The policy is the same as for RV reservations except that we require a \$500.00 deposit. The rates for rentals on Lots 112, 120, 160, 648, 725, 731, 749, 755, 1086, 1088, 1090, 1092, 1093, and 1094 are \$1410.00 for one month, \$1310.00 per month for two months and \$1210.00 for three or more months. If you are renting a park model with a washer and dryer, the cost of \$50.00 is added onto those prices. These prices include propane for cooking (if you have a gas stove), electricity, water, and trash. They do not include phone or cable.

Storage fees – If you own a mobile home, storage is free. If you do not own a mobile home, the cost is \$30.00 per month.

Recycling – Recycling allows us to keep your monthly rates from increasing due to the savings at the landfill. Composting is also appreciated. We still have quite a few residents not separating their recycle items from their trash. We ask that everyone please join us in saving our environment.

As we enter into February, it is again time for mobile homeowners to begin making arrangements for summer lawn care. The park will maintain your lot for \$20.00 per month but due to liability issues, we do not water. We need a Lawn Care Contract completed from each of you identifying who will be responsible during your absence. If you do not make arrangements, the park will mow and weed eat for a cost of \$50.00 each time we have to do it.

If you are leaving sometime in March, we must know NLT mid-February. This applies to both RVers and Mobile Home Owners. Mobile Home owners that are leaving in March will be charged for trash for April if you don't tell us by March 15th when you are planning on departing. We can only pro-rate for the upcoming April departures for RVers if you let us know by March 15th as well.

That makes the efforts of your board, activity chairpersons and the countless volunteers all worthwhile. All of these folks work towards a common purpose: to provide social and recreational activities in a safe environment for all park residents. This newsletter is a communication tool to help keep Trails End-ers informed of the changes as well as the day-to-day social and recreational life at Trails End. We hope it is succeeding in such a goal.

Many of you have commented favorably on our newsletter and to you I say Thank You! Being limited on resources though means I can't do everything so I hope you'll understand if things don't happen or show up as you wish they would.

Know what is going on by attending the Monday Morning meeting at 8:30 a.m. in the Main Hall. All-you-can-drink coffee is free! You'll get all the park info you need straight from the horse's mouth right down to the individual activity coordinator. February is the busiest month of the winter season so I remind and encourage everyone to attend the meeting. The newsletter isn't necessarily perfect and things can and do change after the newsletter is published and distributed. The Monday Morning Meeting is generally the first means of broadcasting that updated information.

Be informed. There are several methods used to disseminate information to park residents. The first and most important is the 8:30 a.m. Monday Morning Meeting in the Main Hall, and the second are the numerous bulletin and activity boards located in the Card Hall. **As a matter of practice, check those activity boards at least once a week (preferably twice) for any new, updated, or changed information.**

Safety. A lot of you are using flashlights but there are still a few bike riders and golf carts out on the streets without headlights and/or taillights. Another item of concern is vehicles in no parking zones. Anywhere the curb is painted red is a no parking zone. If you see something you think is unsafe, report it to the park managers as soon as possible.

Help us out. For those of you, who would like to become more involved in the park, check the list of activities and activity coordinators posted on the Board's (Bulletin) Board. Also check the "Help Wanted" bulletin board. Several good opportunities are awaiting good people. Volunteer positions need to be filled and we urge everyone to consider getting involved. Volunteering is a great way to have fun and meet people.

Newer stuff. Last month we included a "Cook's Corner" featurette where we showcase two prized recipes from two of our park residents (identities a secret). Feedback indicated approval with this feature so we are doing it again with two simple tasty recipes. The recipes owners assure me that these recipes have earned high praise from their consumers so give them a try. They are located on page 14.

Also, in the "EVENTS & calendar highlights for February 2017" starting on page 21, most of the significant events for selected days are now hyperlinked to internet pages so that those of you who read the newsletter on your computer, iPad, tablet, or smartphone can quickly click on the subject for access to more information. Items that are hyperlinked are identified by colored text other than black. Simply mouse over, press & hold Ctrl and click on the item.

THE HEALTH COMMITTEE COORDINATOR'S REPORT



Several events related to your health are coming up!

The Health Committee is in need of large prescription bottles with caps for use in the Vial for Life program. If you have any empty bottles, please donate them by placing in a designated box in the Main Hall where bottle caps, batteries, etc., are collected.

HEART ATTACK - WOMEN

Contrary to any popular belief or myths, women have different feelings and exhibit different signs of behavior when experiencing a heart attack. Recognizing those signs and acting immediately is key to recovery. Here are five signs to be aware of:

1. **Chest pain or discomfort.** Chest pain is the most common heart attack symptom, but many women may experience it differently than men. It may feel like a squeezing or fullness and the pain can be anywhere in the chest, not just on the left side.
2. **Pain in your arm(s), back, neck, or jaw.** This type of pain is more common to women than in men. It may confuse women who expect their pain to be focused on their chest and left arm, not their back or jaw. The pain can be gradual or sudden, and it may wax or wane before becoming intense. If you're asleep, it may awaken you.
3. **Stomach pain.** Be aware that stomach pain can signal a heart attack.
4. **Shortness of breath or lightheadedness.** If you are experiencing these symptoms for no readily apparent reason, you could be having a heart attack, especially if you're also having one of more of the other symptoms listed above.
5. **Breaking out in a cold nervous sweat...** is common among women who are having a heart attack. It will feel more like something stress-related than perspiration usually resulting from physical exertion or spending time outside in the heat.

BOTTOM LINE - If you have chest discomfort, especially if you also have one or more of the other signs listed above, call 911 immediately. Do not delay in getting help.

Finally, we are fast approaching the peak of flu season. If you haven't gotten your flu shot yet, you are at high risk for catching the flu. Several residents have already caught both the flu and the "Texas Crud" and they can testify it was no fun at all. While you are getting your flu shot, you should get a PNEUMONIA SHOT (if you can't remember having one)...once every TEN YEARS is a good idea of how often you should consider this. And, if you have ever had Chicken Pox, you should also think about getting a SHINGLES SHOT."

GO FISHING IN THE GULF!

The fishing trip this month is on February 12th. These trips leave from Port Mansfield. Types of fish caught include Red Snapper (minimum 15" long, 4 per person), grouper, and shark, trigger fish, etc. Fishing licenses are required and can be purchased at Wal-Mart, Weslaco Borderland Ace Hardware, or Academy. Recommend those purchasing day licenses wait until the Saturday phone call before the trip to ensure the trip is still a go. Each trip is limited to 25 fishermen/women with a minimum of 24 persons required. The cost is \$100 per person and is payable in advance, usually five days to a week before the trip.



A fish fry is planned after each trip for those persons who want to donate one of their fish to the fry, or you may opt to keep your entire catch and forgo the fish fry. Note: this decision is made prior to leaving port.

The Trails End Way continues The Cooks Corner feature this month with two new recipes from another random sampling of Trails End residents. We think you'll enjoy preparing and cooking these dishes, and derive even more satisfaction from eating and sharing them with friends. Here they are.

Snow Covered Angel Cake

Ingredients

- One pre-baked angel food cake
- One package 4-serving size instant vanilla pudding
- One 20 oz. can crushed pineapple in juice, undrained
- One cup whipped topping
- Ten whole strawberries

Instructions

Mix pudding and pineapple and gently stir in whipped topping. Cut the cake horizontally into three layers, placing the bottom layer on a plate. Top with one and a third cups pudding mixture. Place second layer on top of first and cover with one cup pudding mixture. Top with last layer of cake. Spread remaining pudding mixture on top and then garnish with strawberries.

Oven Pancakes

In a 9x13 inch baking pan –

Ingredients

- Two tablespoons cooking oil
- Three large eggs
- ½ cup sugar
- One teaspoon salt
- Two cups milk
- 1 ½ cups flour

Instructions

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Add all ingredients in a large bowl then using a mixer, beat for a minimum of two minutes at medium speed. Pour into pan and allow it to level for one minute.

Bake uncovered for 30 minutes. Remove and let stand for 2-3 minutes.

Cut into rectangular sections. Serve with butter and pancake syrup or any topping you typically prefer on pancakes.
