# **PARK MANAGERS MESSAGE**



This winter seems like it has gone by too fast!! As we close this 2016/2017 season, there are a few things we would like you to consider:

- 1. March begins "Open Season" for RVers and occupants of the Park rentals. Open Season means that if you want to reserve a park model, mobile home, or a different RV site than the one you had this season, you can reserve as long as we don't have a reservation for next year already. We require a \$200.00 deposit on RV sites and \$500.00 on rentals. This deposit is refundable in its entirety if you find over the summer or fall that something prohibits you from coming down.
- 2. Mobile home owners should make arrangements for their lawn care over the summer. We need to know who you have hired. The park maintains your yard for a monthly fee of \$20.00. Even though you have all rock, you need to employ someone to round up the weeds. If you are leaving post-dated checks for the summer months, they need to be

made out for \$290.00 per month or if you are a new buyer on the move-in special, please make them out for \$99.00. We have quite a few of you that have not appraised us of their departure dates. The March bills are out but to avoid getting charged for trash and utilities for April, we need to know your departure prior to March 20th.

- 3. We have had an abnormal amount of sending and receiving e-mails for residents. We are happy to accommodate you with this service but it takes time away from our normal duties. In the future, we will implement a charge of \$1.00 per page for receiving and printing your e-mails and a \$5.00 charge for sending your e-mails.
- 4. We have had an abundant amount of homes being sold over the winter so far. That being said, we find that these transactions between maintaining the list of what is for sale, credit/background checks and preparing the proper paperwork is also taking an enormous amount of time. We are happy to accommodate you and the new residents but the time has come that we must begin charging for this service. Beginning March 1<sup>st</sup>, there will be a \$50.00 cash charge for any home that has outstanding paperwork that has not gone forward to Austin.

We hope everyone has enjoyed this winter. We look forward to your returning in the fall of 2017. Please be safe and healthy over the summer.

The Health Committee is in continual need of tall large prescription bottles with caps for use in the Vial for Life program. If you have any empty bottles, please donate them by placing in a designated box in the Main Hall where bottle caps, batteries, etc., are collected.

THINK YOU ARE HAVING A STROKE?

**Call 911 IMMEDIATELY** 

**F.A.S.T.** is an easy way to remember the sudden signs of stroke. When you can spot the signs, you'll know that you need to **call 911 for help** immediately. F.A.S.T. is:

Face Drooping – Does one side of the face droop or is it numb? Ask the person to smile. Is the person's smile uneven?

Arm Weakness – Is one arm weak or numb? Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one arm drift downward?

Speech Difficulty – Is speech slurred? Is the person unable to speak or hard to understand?

Time to call 911 – If someone shows any of these symptoms, even if the symptoms go away, call 911.

### Beyond F.A.S.T. - Other Symptoms You Should Know

- Sudden NUMBNESS or weakness of face, arm, or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Sudden CONFUSION, trouble speaking or understanding speech
- Sudden TROUBLE SEEING in one or both eyes
- Sudden TROUBLE WALKING, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination
- Sudden SEVERE HEADACHE with no known cause

If someone shows any of these symptoms, immediately call 911 or the emergency medical services.

# **FALL PREVENTION - Simple tips to prevent falls**

Falls put you at risk for serious injuries. Prevent falls with these simple fall-prevention measures, from reviewing your medications to hazard-proofing your home.

- 1. Make an appointment with your doctor. Review with him/her the medications you are taking for side effects and interactions that may increase your risk of falling.
- 2. **Keep moving.** Physical activity can go a long way toward fall prevention. With your doctor's ok, consider activities such as walking, water workouts, and easy exercising.
- 3. **Wear sensible shoes.** High heels, floppy slippers, and shoes with slick soles can make you slip, stumble and fall. So can walking in your stocking feet. Wear properly fitting shoes with nonskid soles to prevent falls and reduce joint pain.
- 4. **Remove home hazards.** Make your home safer by removing boxes, newspapers and electrical cords from walkways. Move coffee tables, magazine racks and plant stands from high traffic areas. Secure loose rugs or remove them from your home. Use nonslip mats in the bathtub or shower.
- 5. **Light up your living space.** Keep homes brightly lit to avoid tripping on objects that are hard to see. Place night lights in your bedroom, bathroom and hallways. Store flashlights in easy-to-find places for use during power outages.
- 6. **Use assistive devices** such as hand rails, nonslip treads on bare-wood steps, raised toilet seats, shower or tub grab bars and a plastic seat for shower or tub.

# LEISURE LANE POTLUCK LUNCHEON



# DEEP SEA FISHING IN THE GULF!

The fishing trip this month is on March 12<sup>th</sup>. It will be the last fishing trip for the season.

These trips leave from Port Mansfield. Types of fish caught include the red snapper (minimum 15" long, 4 per person), grouper, and shark, trigger fish, etc. During February's trip, five sharks were caught! Fishing licenses are required and can be purchased at Wal-Mart, Weslaco Borderland Ace Hardware, or Academy. Recommend those purchasing day licenses wait until the Saturday phone call before the trip to ensure the trip is still a



go. Each trip is limited to 25 fishermen/women with a minimum of 24 persons required. The cost is \$100 per person and is payable in advance, usually five days to a week before the trip.



A fish fry is planned after each trip for those persons who want to donate one of their fish to the fry, or you may opt to keep your entire catch and forgo the fish fry. Note: this decision is made prior to leaving port.

A sign-up sheet are posted in the Card Hall. Sign up before March 5<sup>th</sup>! Anyone wanting to go please put your name on the list and if the list is full, sign up anyway in case someone cancels out.


